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237 homes coming to Chapel Hill's Weavers Grove Community

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (October 21, 2021) – With a historic groundbreaking at Weavers Grove on Sunday, October 17, 2021, Chapel Hill is a step closer to having 237 more homes at affordable prices in a neighborhood where people can live close to where they work.

Weavers Grove is a first of its kind mixed-income community offering affordable homeownership to Habitat for Humanity of Orange County families and to market-rate homebuyers. Of the 237 single family homes, townhomes, duplexes, and condominiums, 101 will be Habitat homes owned by people who live or work in Orange County. The remaining market-rate homes, built by Garman Homes and White Oak Properties, will offer new opportunities for Chapel Hill homebuyers, at price ranges lower than today's median home prices.

Speakers at this outdoor event on-site at Weavers Grove included elected officials, key donors, and Habitat for Humanity Leadership. The event was live streamed for the public and is available to view on the Habitat for Humanity of Orange County YouTube Channel at www.weaversgrove.org/groundbreaking.

"This is exactly the kind of work we need to be doing everywhere in the world. In creating a mixed-income community, you are not just building homes, but building community," said Habitat for Humanity International CEO Jonathan Reckford. "We know if a child grows up in a mixed-income community, they stay healthier, have a better opportunity to be well educated and has a better opportunity to grow into all God intends for their life."

"This is the most audacious project we have ever attempted in our 37-year history," said Jennifer Player, Habitat for Humanity of Orange County CEO and President. "Our vision for Weavers Grove is to create a cohesive community where people from diverse backgrounds -- whether that is income, age, or race -- can gather and build authentic relationships amongst the community spaces of Weavers Grove."

During this event, Habitat announced the public phase of the Weavers Grove \$7.5 million Capital Campaign. The vision for affordable homeownership has inspired gifts beyond what was thought possible during the campaign quiet phase. The Campaign Steering Committee, co-chaired by volunteers Betsy Blackwell and Mimi Hock, has skillfully implemented a fundraising strategy, with more than \$4.7 million in gifts and pledges committed during the campaign quiet phase. Other funding sources to build this \$26 million community will come from government funding, sale of lots to market rate builders, and Habitat for Humanity's annual fundraising.

To inspire more community support, The Kenan Charitable Trust has issued a Matching Gift Challenge for all new gifts and new pledges to Weavers Grove, up to \$450,000 as well as contributing \$50,000 toward Habitat's annual fund. Matching donations can be made at www.weaversgrove.org/donate.

Infrastructure for Weavers Grove is currently underway with construction on these homes is set to begin in 2023 and continue through 2028.
